To effectively deal with this challenge, MHA has launched the National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal (www.cybercrime.gov.in) and National Cyber Helpline Number 1930 on which Citizens can immediately report online financial fraud and other Cybercrime. However, the effectiveness of these platforms depends on wider public awareness. Cooperation of State Governments/UTs is essential to spread cyber awareness to the entire country, especially rural and remote areas to achieve this objective. In this direction, we humbly request your cooperation in following initiatives at the state level:

- (i) Inclusion of cyber awareness in State level Digital literacy programmes and public relations campaigns.
- (ii) Advising citizens to follow/subscribe the Ministry of Home Affair's official social media handle "Cyberdost" for Cyber Awareness.
- (iii) Display of helpline (1930) and portal information at public places, Police Stations and Government Offices.
- (iv) Inclusion of helpline and Portal information in advertisements and utility bills of State schemes.
- (v) Propagate the message in collaboration with local influential persons, educational institutions and community heads.
- (vi) Inclusion of topics related to cyber security in school courses and teacher training.

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In this regard, the "Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre" may be contacted for any cooperation from the Ministry of Home Affairs.

We believe that this collective effort will discourage cyber criminals and assure citizens of their safety from cybercrimes. We are committed to work in coordination with State agencies towards making India digitally secure.

You are requested to kindly issue necessary guidelines to the concerned departments based on the above points.
